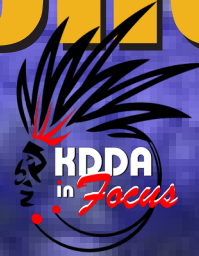

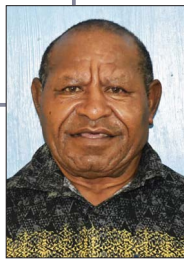

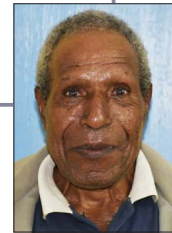

OVERVIEW OF DSIP, PSIP & LLGSIP

The District Service Improvements Program (DSIP) Provincial Service Improvements Programs (PSIP) & Local Level Government Service Improvement Program (LLGSIP) policy recognizes the ALOTAU ACCORD in term of service delivery & development in the rural areas for minimum social and economic services.

● It also recognizes agencies & stakeholders involvement in supporting delivery functions of basic goods and services to the provinces, districts and LLG areas. Agencies & Stakeholders include:

- 22 Provincial Administrations
- JPP & BPC in provinces, JDP & BPC in districts, LLGC & Ward Development Committees.
- CSTB, PSTB, PPMT & DPMT
- Departments of Planning, Finance, PLGA, Education, Agriculture, Transport, Works, Commerce, Health, PNG Power, PNG Water and Telecom.
- Churches, NGOs, private sectors, development partners.
- Policy prerequisites include: available 5 – Year Province/ District/ LLG Development Plans.

Infrastructure Support Services

The purpose of Infrastructure Support Services in a district is to provide support and resources for the development and maintenance of infrastructure within the district. This includes physical structures such as roads, bridges, buildings, and water supply systems, as well as other essential services such as waste management, energy supply, and telecommunications.

Health Service Improvement

The purpose of Health Services Improvements in a district is to improve the availability, accessibility, and quality of healthcare services for the residents of the district.

Education Service Support

To support parents in remote locations in the district to have children have access to quality education that will help them develop the foundational skills they need to succeed in later education and in life. And furthermore, create accessible pathways for the children to acquire further knowledge.

Law & Justice Services

The purpose of Law and Justice Services in a district is to promote and ensure the rule of law, protect the rights and safety of citizens, and provide access to justice for all residents of the district.

Economic Sector Support

The purpose of Economic Sector Support in a district is to support the growth and development of the local economy by providing resources, expertise, and support to businesses and entrepreneurs thus enhance the growth in the economy policing.

Administration Services

The purpose of Administration in a district is to manage and coordinate the day-to-day operations of the district government, and to ensure that public services are delivered effectively and efficiently to residents.

Road sealing: He has allocated funds to seal roads in the district and link Kerowagi district to Kundiawa Town, which is about 35km away.

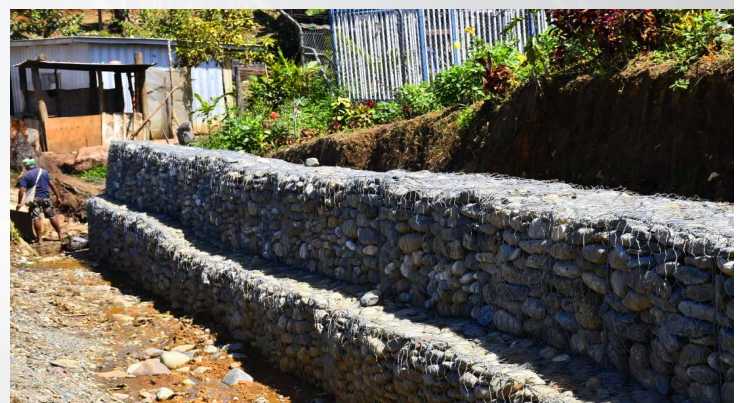
LINE DRAINAGE SYSTEM UPGRADE AT KEROWAGI TOWN

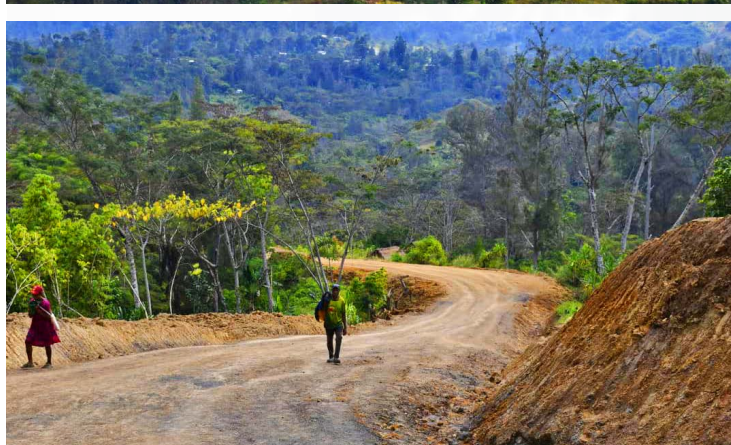
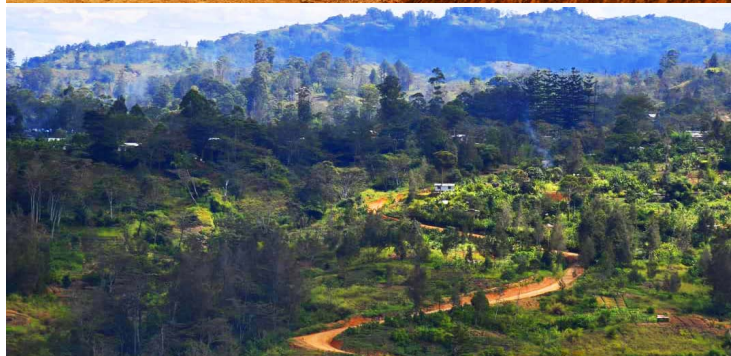


Strong stones have been installed in Kerowagi Township area where erosions have been very constant.

UPGRADES OF MAIN ROAD LINKS

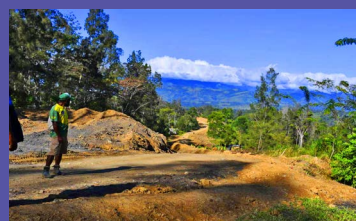
Kerowagi Town to Singe Kambu Road upgrading

The machinery includes a grader, a backhoe, and a water pump, which were handed over to the current MP, Hon. Francis Kikin Siune, so that he can continue the infrastructure development work that they started during their terms and continue what he as already started after taking office.

The current MP is optimistic about the benefits of receiving the machinery assets, such as improved reliability, longer asset life, increased productivity, flexibility, better asset management, and financial benefits. 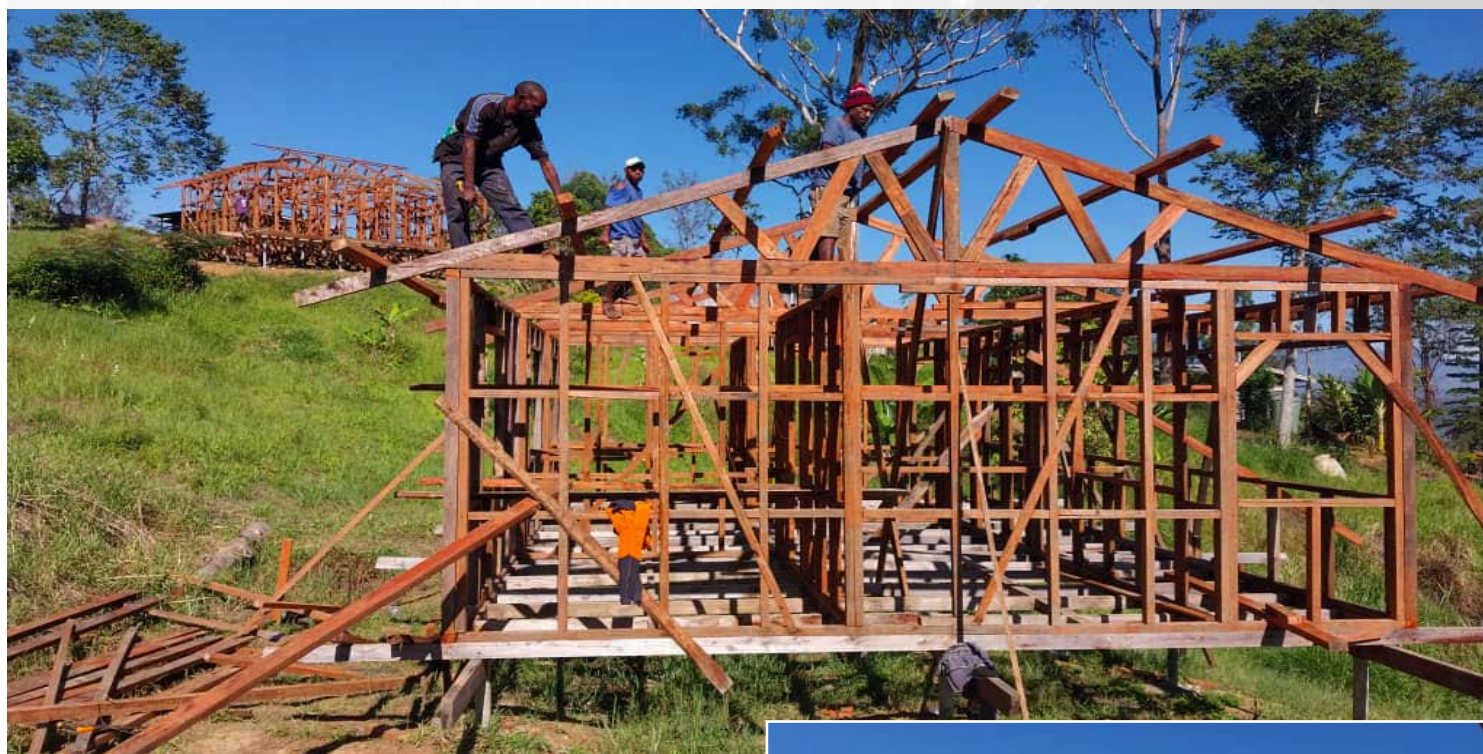
The transition from primary to junior high school is a significant change that can bring new opportunities and challenges for students and parents alike.

KDDA aims to roll out similar projects in various schools within the district.





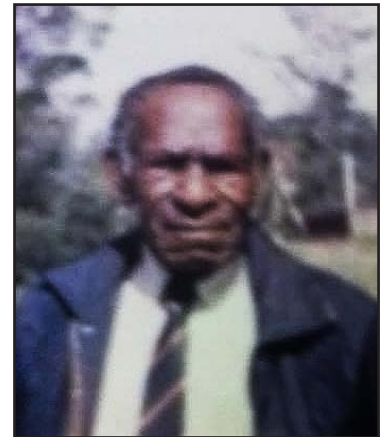

BRIEF HISTORY:

Siwi Korondo came from the Gena Tribe in Kerowagi District. He was a Chief amongst the Gena people and highly respected by all. Immediately after Self-Government and Independence, interim provincial area authorities were established around the country and he was appointed as the Chairman. The "authorities" was known as the Simbu Provincial Interim Authority. He served that office from 1977-1980.

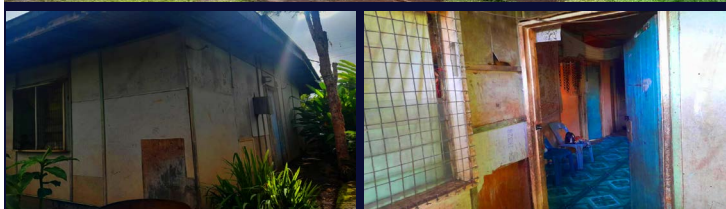
Law & Justice Services

KEROWAGI POLICE STATION AND STAFF HOUSING HAVE BEEN LISTED FOR MAJOR UPGRADING IN 2024



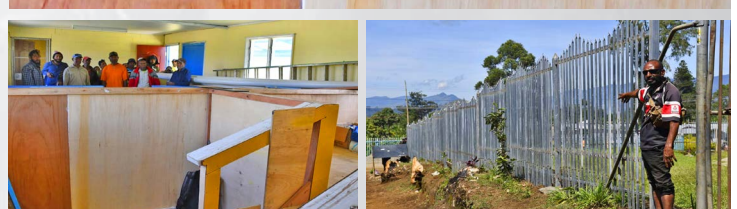

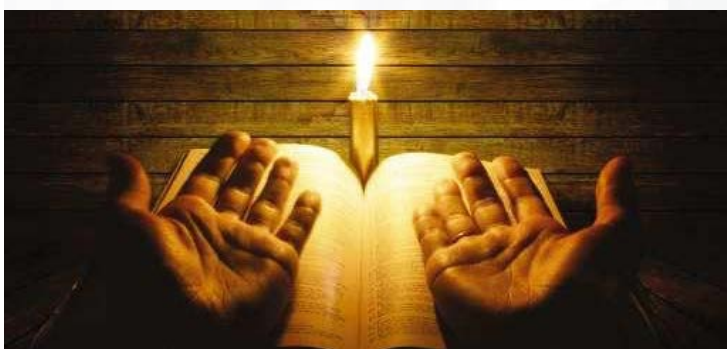
The government only needs provide resources and tools to support faith-based and community-based organizations in their volunteer efforts.

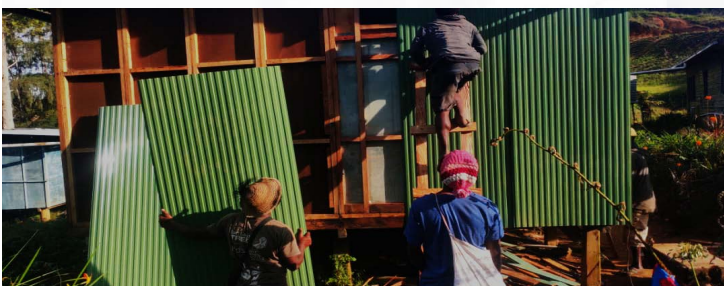

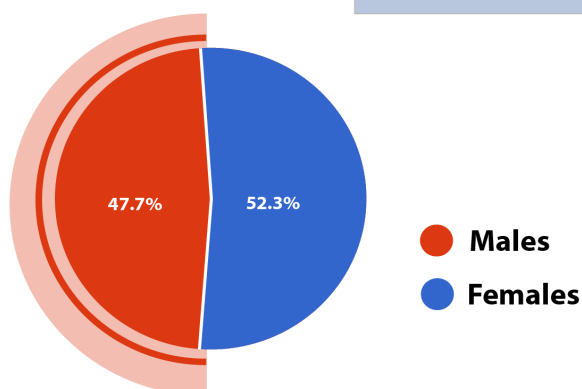

LOCATION COORDINATES

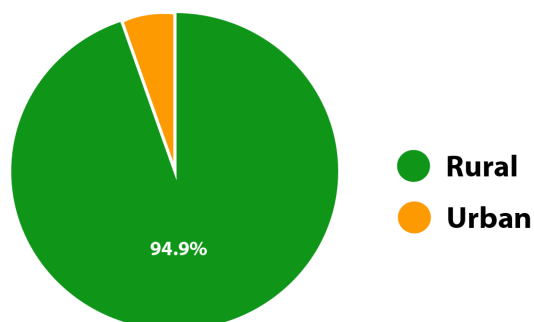
